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Manual Overview

This manual is intended for the use of the All American Scoreboard owners and users. Read this manual carefully before starting the equipment.

This manual contains important information for operation and maintenance of the equipment. It also contains important instructions to prevent accidents, personal injury and/or serious damage prior to or during operation of the equipment.

Familiarize yourself thoroughly with the function and operation of this equipment and strictly observe the directions given. If you have any questions or need further details on specific aspects related to the AAS system, please do not hesitate to contact us.

In this manual you will find three levels of flagged notes or warnings.

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Description

Your All American Scoring Table has been carefully inspected and tested before leaving the factory. It is possible, however, that components may be loosened or forced out of adjustment in transit. If this occurs, follow the troubleshooting guide (section 4). If equipment then fails to operate, contact immediately:

NOTE: If you need to send parts in for repair, please call the ALL AMERICAN service department for a returned goods authorization (RGA) number.

1.2 Damage

Upon receipt, check for visible damage. If this occurs, or if damage is found after shipment has been accepted, follow the damage claim procedure.

1.3 Damage Claim Procedure

An instruction sheet is enclosed advising the consignee in case of damage in transit. If damage is noted at the time of delivery, consignee must obtain an 'Inspection of Bad Order' from the delivering carrier. In order to process your claim, this must be properly filled out with a complete statement of all damage and it must be signed by the carrier.

If damage is discovered after delivery, you should call the delivery company. Have them make out a Concealed Damage Report. Fifteen days after delivery are allowed, so this should be done promptly or it is impossible to process this claim.

Advise EVERBRITE corporation of necessary replacement parts or repairs.

Consignee will be invoiced and then should file a claim with the carrier to recover charges. To file your claim follow this procedure:

- (A) Cost of replacement parts or repair charges are invoiced to the carrier by the consignee.
- (B) The following documents, properly filled out, plus invoice are forwarded to the trucking company in support of your claim:
 - (a) Original bill of lading
 - (b) Original paid freight bill
 - (c) Certified copy of original invoice
 - (d) Standard form for presentation of loss and damage claim



2. INSTALLATION

2.1 General Information

Shipping papers accompany each scoring table. Check carefully to see that you receive everything ordered.

2.2 Uncrate Scoreboard

Carefully uncrate scoreboard.

2.3 Inspection

Tighten all screws, lamps, and fittings that may have loosened in shipment.

2.4 Setup

Scoreboard is shipped with the table top in the upright position (Figure 1). Carefully lower table top to a horizontal position (Figure 2).

CAUTION: The table is not ready to use until wings are unfolded to properly support the tabletop. See next page for details.

INSTALLATION

Referring to figures 2 and 3, while holding table top pull wings out until they are perpendicular to the back of the scoring table. The underside of the tabletop has rubber footings that each wing locks into (see figure 4).

If not already installed, install the end pads on the table, making sure the left pad goes on the left side and the right pad goes on the right side. The pads will fit into the keyhole slots and drop down into position.

Position the table as needed and plug the power cord into an outlet.



2.5 Wheel Locking

The wheels on the scoreboard can be locked into position. This will help to keep the scoretable in place during operation. Before moving the scoretable, it is recommended to release all locks on the wheels.

2.6 Electrical Connections

The All American Scoretable comes equipped with a 6 Output power strip attached. This power strip is intended for use with an All American Scoreboards Console, a Possession Indicator and the illuminated ad panel on the front of the scoretable. Feed the cables from any desktop devices through the wire pass through holes at the top of the table.



This scoring table plugs into a 120 V. 20 AMP AC outlet.

2.7 Optional Free Standing Padded Possession Indicator



To operate the LED Possession Indicator, flip the switch on the back of the indicator towards the direction of the possession arrow that should be lit. Move switch to the center position to turn indicators off.

3.0 Safety Information

Do not operate the sign until it is completely assembled and installed per the instructions supplied by AAS.

AAS recommends that your main power be installed by a licensed electrician in accordance with the local building and electrical codes.

All equipment must be grounded in accordance with the local building and electrical codes. AAS recommends Earth Link Ground.

If any part of the Scoreboard equipment is malfunctioning or has been damaged, cease operation and consult with AAS Technical Support or qualified service technician before further use.

Use only AAS specified or recommended replacements parts.



WARNING! USE A LOCK OUT/TAG OUT ON CIRCUIT BREAKERS OR "POWER ON/OFF" SWITCHES WHEN PERFORMING INSTALLATION, REPAIRS OR MAINTENANCE.

When performing repairs be mindful of the weather and work area conditions. Avoid the unit's exposure to the elements, water and debris, or anything that may be dangerous or cause damage to the equipment.
